Library Activity in December/January

- With the start of the new year, our two newest employees, Sydney Ziemniak and Anna Collier, begin working as our new Library Assistants on January 2. Sydney and Anna bring a wealth of customer service experience to the Library and will add greatly to our incredible staff.
- Our Winter Reading Program for all ages runs through January 31.
- Renters of Community Hall and the Board Room can now pay by credit card! Thus far, people have been very pleased to be able to have this very basic convenience available to them at last and not have to find their checkbooks. We thank Finance Director Renee Meinzolz and Village Clerk Karla Endres for setting up our payment system so that it works for all parties involved!
- I let SCLS know that we are interested in pursuing the e-rate program. There are a few bureaucratic steps that they (and I need to complete) but then we should be included in their application for the year.
- Our new digital subscription to the New York Times has been popular in the week or so it's been live. Beyond the online paper, access includes the bonus features like food sections and the games, like Wordle. It's not an inexpensive subscription, but if people use it, I'm happy to provide the service.
- Our library system's migration to our new library operating software is looming ever-closer: we're going live with our switch on April 16. The current system switches off on April 13
- We ended the year up slightly in our physical checkout count for the year. Digital circulation continues to grow, although not as steeply as in previous years. Visits to the library and program attendance stayed steady. At my meeting on January 8 with my peers around the county, this is the trend around the system and nationally – with library usage flat overall with circulation numbers declining slightly. In 2025, overall circulation in SCLS declined by about 1%, with many library seeing similar drops. Even libraries known for their robust checkouts numbers saw declines from previous strong growth; Verona, long the library with the strongest annual growth traditionally, "only" only saw a 0.5% increase. Physical circulation does tend to wax and wane overtime, but the softening of digital checkouts is worth noting. I'll have more on this as it dovetails with the County's Partners in Community grant to promote library use, plus the discussions around literacy in general in America as well as what the role of public libraries should be going forward.

Youth Services Report by Brittany Gitzlaff

Everything continued as usual as we wrapped up the final month of the year. We all enjoyed a pause in programming to celebrate the holidays and begin to gear up for the new year. After Amy decided to revamp the adult Winter Reading Program, of course we had to follow suit for the kids and teens. She did an awesome job, and it's been a huge hit! We have heard from parents that the new game-board style has been super motivating for kids, and the kids really enjoy their color changing cups. In keeping with the theme, Jody created another amazing Spy tank, which the kids absolutely love. We also

incorporated a "Kid Recommendations: Best Books of 2025" display into the program, and the kids are so excited to share their favorite books with us. With some end-of-the-year budget to spend, we were able to purchase an additional shelving unit for the kids' area that will help us create more display space for new books. We also purchased and added to the collection more Tonieboxes and Tonie figures, and even more Vox books and Wonderbooks.

Adult Services & Community Engagement Report by Amy Sampson

In December, winter reading started with a new format. We purchased branded library drinkware (mugs for adults, color changing cups for kids) for prizes and those have been very popular. Laura and I held the first Library After Hours adult program with a Trivia Night! We had 52 attendees on a Friday night, and received a lot of positive feedback. I have started advertising for the Community Art Supply Swap in February and am starting to receive donations of supplies.

We are now able to accept credit card payment for room reservations. Andrea and I will start developing a policy for deposits in January. I updated the website to reflect 2026 pricing.

Emily and I placed our first orders for the Friends-funded Overdrive Advantage collection, focusing on purchasing titles with the highest number of holds and single-use licenses for holds that have been active longest.

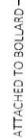

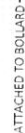
ADA SIGN POST/BOLLARD DETAIL

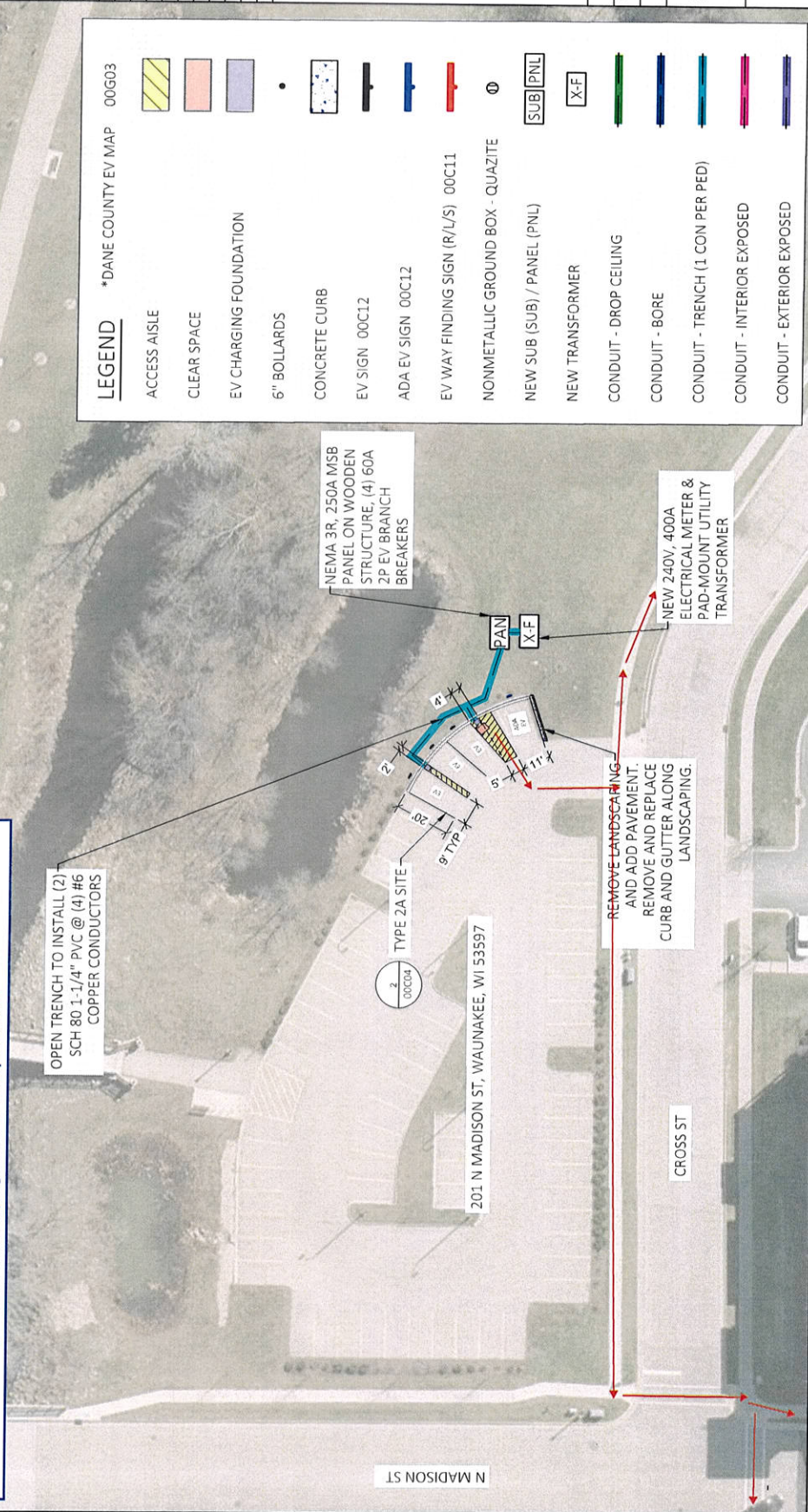

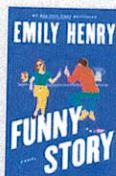

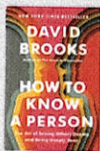
