

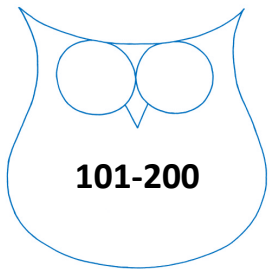

Children learn best when they are in a good mood, so read with your child when the experience will be the most enjoyable for you both. Reading together should never be a chore.

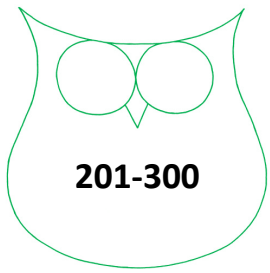
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Early Literacy Tip:

Expose your child to a variety of different types of stories and words. When you have the opportunity, introduce new stories so your child has a chance to hear and experiment with as many new words and concepts as possible.

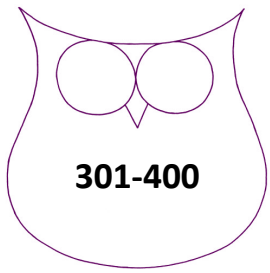
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Early Literacy Tip:

Young children love to hear the same book read over and over again. Remember that they are learning through this repetition. Their developing brains need it in order to create strong pathways.

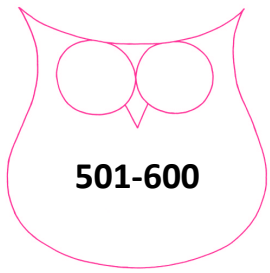

Scribbles may not look like much, but using crayons and pencils to form lines and shapes on paper helps children begin to understand how writing works. It helps to build letter recognition as well!



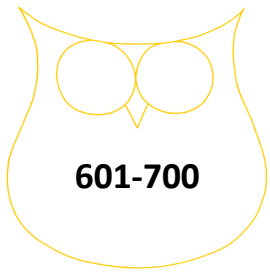
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Early Literacy Tip:

Talk about a specific letter each day or each week. Use it as often as possible and exaggerate the words that start with that particular letter.

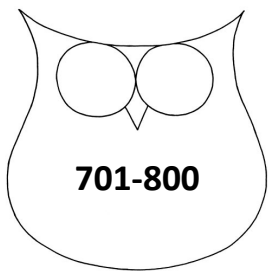
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Early Literacy Tip:

Retelling stories is a great way to build language skills and reinforce the memory of what you have just read. Ask your child what happened during the story, or have your child tell it back to you in their own way.

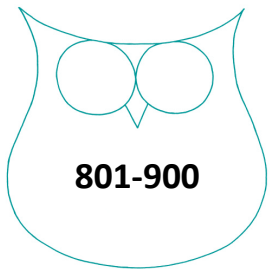
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Early Literacy Tip:

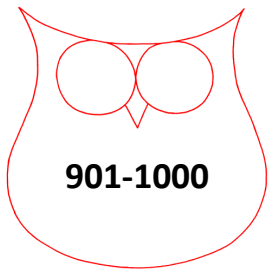
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Early Literacy Tip:
