Waunakee Public Library Activity Report Library Director Erick Plumb July 18, 2025

Library Activity in June/July

- We are in the thick of the Summer Reading Program. Due to Sun Prairie Library's closure for much of June, we saw plenty of new faces along with all our regular users. Thus far, it's been a very gratifyingly busy and very loud summer.
- In recent weeks, I met with all 28 library employees individually for my annual Check-In with the Director, and I'm pleased to report that you have a very happy, albeit busy, library staff! Checkins focused on internal communication, continuing education opportunities, workflow matters, and the working environment in the staff room.
- We are still set for our new library website to launch on August 19. Staff have begun training on how to work on the site. We are thrilled to move forward with this, as our current site is... lacking, to be charitable.
- I'm beginning to prepare for the 2026 budget, due to the Finance Department on July 25. One new service we have contracted to offer is full access to the online *New York Times* and its various features, such as the word games and food sections and the *Athletic* sports section. Our service starts January 1. Additionally, we will be beefing up our budget for our well-circulating video game collection.
- A lawn mower kicked up a rock and shattered a window in the Children's Room in an unfortunate mishap. Jeff Witt is working on replacing the window. The shattered window was a popular children's attraction before storytime the day of the incident.
- The Village is pursuing a grant from the Dane County Office of Energy & Climate Change for the
 installation of publicly-accessible EV charging sites. This program will pay for the EV charging
 equipment for 4 spaces per site, with priority for spaces near multi-family or higher density
 areas. The Village proposal would place four spaces in the Library's south (overflow) lot, near
 the lot entrance on Cross Street, facing the Madison & Main apartments.

Youth Services Report by Brittany Gitzlaff

In June we began the Summer Reading Program, and had one of our busiest months to date. Our big performers this month were Havens Petting Farm, which brought in over 600 people, followed by two shows by Absolute Science the next week. The book bike made its return, and we joined the Village Center for the Big Rig Gig and Play in Your Park.
